

SUPER SCIENCE

From 'How can we get stronger?' to 'What makes things fizz?' we have been asking some big questions in the science room of Keystone over the course of the year. I have been delighted to see our students getting involved in challenges such as building a bridge across a sink; to hear them asking questions such as 'when did time begin?' and to see them growing in confidence and developing their scientific skills.

Whilst all the year groups have stepped up to the challenges of learning science in their own way, I wanted to highlight the progress of our current year 7 students. Both the Einstein and Turing classes have been working exceptionally hard in science over the past couple of months. During this time, they have shown considerable care and attention to perform their first dissection. We used the opportunity to compare different structures within a chicken leg. Students particularly enjoyed testing the knee joint and poking the bone marrow.





More recently Year 7s have been investigating different forces using paper airplanes, newton meters and playdough amongst other things. They have been using the opportunity to focus on their graph drawing skills and carrying out different investigations into the effects of forces, such as determining the effect on the size of an ink splat if they drop more ink. I am looking forward to seeing them build on these skills as their journey through Keystone continues.






At the climbing wall, students have been given the chance to try bouldering and roped climbing as well as testing themselves on the fun walls. As with gymnastics, qualified coaches have been on hand to offer expert tips and guidance to help the students improve. 
